Social Studies Cornerstone - Geography By Mrs. Jami Phillips, 5th/6th Grade

Geography is a cornerstone of social studies. It puts history in context. Physical geography, the natural features and processes of the planet, provides barriers and bridges for people as they migrate and subdue the land. A region's geography affects the way a culture develops and how its people are governed. Mrs. Phillips' fifth and sixthgrade classes began the year with an in-depth study of the geography of their respective curricula. Fifth graders focused on the United States, while sixth studied graders the world. In the age of more and more screen time in terms of digital learning and personal entertainment, students really enjoy a good, old-fashioned color,

cut, and glue activity. Students received an oversized black-and-white line map. They completed tasks finding and identifying political and natural features and indicating those on their maps. Students spent quite a bit of time learning how to use an atlas as well as exploring current information from an online almanac. The huge world map covering our classroom wall became more than a decoration and continues to be used extensively whenever we encounter a new place, especially in our study of current events. Fifth grade explored U.S. time zones, and sixth grade explored the changing of dates and seasons. We were recently able to revisit some of these concepts as

we examined New Year's traditions around the world. Social studies is meant to increase students' awareness of their world, locally and globally, and their place in it. Geography helps them understand that place!


The Bobcat Chess team is gearing up for the Dent Phelps Chess Tournament that will be held February 10th for all Dent Phelps Chess team members.



Dent-Phelps R-III implements a National Archery School Program, NASP, in the month of January during their P.E. time. We also offer an after-school Archery Club for 4th and 5th, and for 6th -8th grades during the month of January. Archery can be very beneficial for children. It is a sport of concentration that can improve hand-eye coordination, mental acuity, strength, and endurance. It can also encourage self- reflection and discipline plus give students a sense of accomplishment. The discipline derives from the need for consistency. They learn to understand that small changes when shooting an arrow can influence where the arrow lands on the target and problem solve what they are doing differently each time. For an archer to hit the bull's eye consistently he or she must have the same stance, draw, anchor, and aim. As a beginning archer this is something they must learn through practice with some trial and error, thus the problem solving. Practice builds upper body strength and increases hand flexibility, which builds the muscle memory they need to succeed, meaning archery takes commitment and time to learn, teaching them patience and how to focus.

The Mission of NASP is to teach the international-style target archery to students from 4th -12th grades. All students use a Genesis Bow with an adjustable draw weight of 10-20 lbs. The Genesis compound bow is used in competition from fourth all the way through high school. If students achieve a high enough score, they can continue to state or national competitions. Dent-Phelps R-III had ten students last year who qualified for the State Competition in Branson, Missouri. It was a great experience for the archers, parents, and coaches. Here at Dent-Phelps R-III up to twenty students can shoot at a time. At the state level up to one hundred twenty students shoot on each flight. Over two thousand students around Missouri competed at the state level last year. Scholarships are awarded to the top competitors at the state and national level.


